selves prepared and conditioned to hear the Holy Spirit's voice when he leads us to do or say something that will bring people closer to God. Two activities in particular are a good start for being conditioned for the Lord's service: Bible study and diligent prayer.

Both of these activities are what prepare us to be nimble. The structure of disciplined Bible study and prayer prepare us so at a moment's notice we can snap to attention and go about our Father's business.

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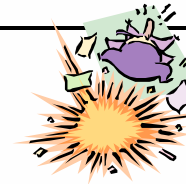

Luke in his Gospel wrote in Chapter 24 an interesting scene of Jesus after his resurrection. Jesus was on the road to Emmaus (Warm Springs) walking with two (number of adequate witness) of his followers, one of whom was named Cleopas (renowned father). Jesus, it was understood, from his own lips said that he only did what he saw his Father doing.^[2] It is interesting then that he should be found walking with a man named “Renowned Father” while the name of the other believer is not mentioned. Since all

Believers' Conversation

The conversation of the two, prior to Jesus joining them, had centered on the events of the recent Passover^[4] involving the trial, death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus.

They were so surprised when Jesus asked, “**What things?**” They then rehearsed to him the recent events that had the whole region talking. What these Believers were doing is exactly what all Believers are to do. Tell the story. Telling the story encourages other Believers, or each other, and builds up the Believer's faith. These Believers on the road that day were actually telling Jesus the Gospel, the Good News!

Beyond that, when the story is told to the person who does not believe, they are given hope for themselves to

Luke 24:13-29 (NIV)

13Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus,^[a] about seven miles^[b] from Jerusalem. 14They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. 15As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; 16but they were kept from recognizing him. 17He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?" They stood still, their faces downcast. 18One of them, named Cleopas,^[c] asked him, "Are you only a visitor to Jerusalem^[d] and do not know the things that have happened there in these days?" 19"What things?" he asked. "About Jesus of Nazareth,"^[e] they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. 20The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; 21but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel.^[f] And what is more, it is the third day^[g] since all this took place. 22In addition, some of our women amazed us. They

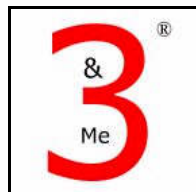

went to the tomb early this morning 23but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. 24Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but him they did not see." 25He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! 26Did not the Christ^[h] have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" 27And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself. 28As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus acted as if he were going farther. 29But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them

place their trust in Jesus the Christ and be saved, healed, and delivered which is what the original Greek word used, which was translated "saved" (sozo), meant.

Jesus Chides Them

Jesus noticed the men had downcast faces as they stood still there on the road relating their story. It was at this point that he chided them for how slow they were in their hearts to believe the prophets who had foretold the very events which of necessity had taken place.^[5] How like many Believers today, who have heard the story, accepted Jesus, and become frozen in place, paralyzed, powerless, and downcast because they have not spent life-filled time on the road with the Master. They "bought the fire insurance," but not the "life assurance" in the here and now offered by Jesus in his passing the resurrection power to those who believe in John 17:20-26. Many have been on the road of life with him but have not been able to understand or discern that Jesus said that he was in us and that we were his body. When Jesus was in only one

body he did mighty things in that one body.^[6] He is now in many bodies and is willing to work through those bodies to show his glory.

We now live in a time when we need to heed the words of prophets and recognize that these are the days of power being thrust back into all believers, who will accept God flowing through them in power to demonstrate the truth of God's word to a lost, floundering, and dying world. These days are the days foretold long ago. We must not be slow of heart in this hour for we have more scripture to understand and function in than the first century church. Back then, 2000 years ago, people were come against for preaching the resurrection, just as today people are come against for preaching that power has been resurrected in the Body of Christ for all who are not slow of heart to function in the word and receive it. The Holy Spirit is revealing, more and more each day, that we can walk in power to show that God's Kingdom is in us. Allow him to work through you, daily!
