Acts 2:1-13

Pentecost is celebrated in much of the Christian World on the Seventh Sunday after Passover. Pentecost is in fact the Birthday of the church, the Body of Christ. Pentecost is to the Believer in Jesus the Christ a very exciting and encouraging event! There is not time or space here to fully cover all the aspects of Pentecost but this time will serve as an appetizer to the things of Pentecost and the story of what occurred that day in Jerusalem, 33AD, which continues to shake the world.

The Day Of Pentecost The scripture tells us in Acts 2:1-2:

> ¹When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place.

Sunday. The Day of Pentecost was already a Sabbath on the Jewish calendar before the event of the Believers being filled with the Holy Spirit. Pentecost was also known as Feast of Weeks. Feast of Harvest, and Feast of First Fruits, all together.

The Body Of Christ

The Body of Christ became welded together by power and with power on Pentecost. One of the evidences of this event was the result of cloven tongues found in Acts 2:3-4. Notice the tongues were as if they were completely split. This empowered those present to speak in different languages, unknown to them as well as a heavenly language known only to God. (I Corinthians 14:2)

The Body Filled

The Body of Jesus the Christ possesses more ability than any of the parts severally! Scripture tells us one can put 1,000 to flight and two can put 10,000. Just think what many in unison can accomplish. A divided body is limited but a whole body is invincible!(Luke 11:17) It is important to remember a part is a part of something greater than itself.
