8By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance. obeyed; and he went out, not By Mrs. Sojourner

knowing whither he went. 9By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise: 10For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God. Heb. 11:1-3.6-1(KJV)

Noah heeded God's warning and walked out the vision God gave him irregardless of what people around him said or did. Many people would say that Abraham wandered aimlessly for decades. sowing and reaping. Both the sewer and the reaper are an important part of the cycle of life and the sustaining of life.

"My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work." What an astonishing statement this must have been as it fell on the disciples' ears!

What a astonishing statement it still is today!

Nourishing the Physical

The disciples had just returned from going to procure food. They could all eat now for their physical needs could be met.

Returning, they saw Jesus engaged in conversation with a woman who did not meet the standards of propriety in the understanding of the Jews. Even though they did not understand why he would be talking to this "Samaritan



woman," they asked no questions of him. They had, no doubt, learned from past encounters that Jesus always had a reason

for his actions, no matter how "outside the box' what he was doing seemed!

Putting Down the Task

While the disciples were concerned with the physical needs, just being realistic, the woman leaves Jesus at Jacob's Well, along with her water jar, to hurry back into town to tell of this man-the Messiah!

Notice, she has left behind her natural purpose... to fetch water for the day's physical needs. Why? She does this because her real needs, the spiritual needs she has yearned to satisfy, her eternal needs have been met!

Sowing Work Done

Jesus tells his disciples the hard work of sowing, tending, and watering has been done. Now, sowing and planting are being done simultaneously!

Encoding the Message

The people of Sychar first believed because of this unnamed woman's report. They then invited Jesus to stay with them, which he did for two days. They believed first because of the woman's report. By the end of two days the people reported, to the woman, that the reason for their faith was no longer her report, but because they had met the source of her faith personally!
