#### **Have You Ears?**

Do you have ears? Are you able to listen and are you teachable? Do you do what you hear is to be done? Faith comes by hearing the

Word of God, (regular exposure to the Word)!

His Disciples Asked

The secrets are yours if you will ask for them to be revealed to you. "Draw near to God and he will draw near to



you," the scripture assures us. "Ask and you will receive,"

Notice, Jesus told the story of the sowing to everyone present and set in motion the opportunity to cover any spiritual location of his listeners.

#### Where Seed Falls

A seed has little or no ability to determine where it falls and, therefore, is planted. The outcome of a seed and its germination are dependent upon where it is planted.

Insight as to the challenges of life can be seen in the examples of what Jesus said happens to a non-husbanded seed.

- Along path—trampled & eaten by birds of air
- On rock withered no moisture, no baptism
- Among thorns choked

### Scripture:

Luke 8:4-15 (NIV)

<sup>4</sup>While a large crowd was gathering and people were coming to Jesus from town after town, he told this parable: 5"A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path; it was trampled on, and the birds of the air ate it up. <sup>6</sup>Some fell on rock, and when it came up. the plants withered because they had no moisture. <sup>7</sup>Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up with it and choked the plants. <sup>8</sup>Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up and yielded a crop, a hundred times more than was sown." When he said this, he called out. "He who has ears to hear. let him hear." <sup>9</sup>His disciples asked him what this parable meant. <sup>10</sup>He said, "The knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of God has been given to you, but to others I speak in parables, so that, " 'though seeing, they may not see; though hearing, they may not understand.'[a] 11"This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God. <sup>12</sup>Those along the path are the ones who hear, and then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so

that they may not believe and be saved. <sup>13</sup>Those on the rock are the ones who receive the word with joy when they hear it, but they have no root. They believe for a while, but in the time of testing they fall away. <sup>14</sup>The seed that fell among thorns stands for those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by life's worries, riches and pleasures, and they do not mature. <sup>15</sup>But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart, who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce a crop.

### Your Soil is the Key

You have control over yourself and what you allow to grow in you. Your soil is your choice. The quality of your seed will depend upon how you nourish it with the Word

### What Seeds Do you Pant?

Jesus made it clear that a seed that survives the knocks of life yields a harvest.

Notice here the word "vields." When we produce. we must yield or give away (gift) some of ourselves to produce seeds that will, in turn, grow healthily and in turn, produce a hundredfold crop.

Reaping is a reward of blessing as a good and faithful servant of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ! Grow, go, plant, and raise the crop of Christ!

### Just so you'll know:
