What a marvelous thing it is to hear how God the Father raised Jesus the Christ from death to life, just as he had promised!

No One Killed Jesus!

No one killed Jesus! "Oh, yes they did," you say, "the Romans and the Jews killed Jesus!" Well, they were the stage hands in the plan of redemption, but in the final event they did not kill Jesus. Jesus gave up his spirit to the Father. By doing so he left his lifeless body there on the cross for the redemption of all mankind. Look at the scripture in Matthew. Jesus cried out and gave up his spirit, [1] No one took his life, he gave it up voluntarily. No man can kill God!

The Temple Curtain Tore

It was when Jesus gave up his spirit that the Temple Curtain tore from top to bottom. Now, the curtain was several stories tall and several inches thick, so the fact that it tore

from top to bottom proved no man could have done it. The curtain symbolized man's separation from God by sin. Serving as a reminder of the barrier which existed up until Jesus took mankind's sins and sicknesses on himself, the curtain now showed the barrier no longer existed because mankind could boldly approach God through the blood and death of Jesus the Christ.

Tombs Broke Open

Tombs broke open, [2] we are told and, "The bodies of many holy people were raised to life." This would certainly seem to dispel any ideas concerning the disciples stealing Jesus' body from the tomb to stage a fake resurrection! This is in fact a foreshadowing of when Jesus comes to get his bride, the believers

know where they have put him." ¹⁴At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. 15"Woman," he said, "why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him." ¹⁶Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means Teacher). ¹⁷Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet returned to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am returning to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.' " 18 Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that he had said these things to her.

who have died when they are raised from the grave to meet him in the air. This event had many witnesses according to scripture.^[3] It is interesting to note that while these were raised from the dead they did not go into the city until Jesus was resurrected and returned to the holy city.[4] Even nonbelievers were forced by what they saw to acknowledge Jesus was the Son of God. [5]

Do Not Touch Me

When Mary Magdalene was at the tomb after Jesus' resurrection, she was weeping greatly when she did not find his body in the tomb. She

encountered two angels (two is the number of adequate witness). Mary turned after they asked her why she was crying only to see the Lord himself standing there (three is the number of perfect witness). Mary did not recognize him at first even after he spoke to her (It is important to expect the Lord to be in a person's life and to speak to them). She realized it was the Lord when he called her name. The same is true today when people encounter the Lord when he calls out their name. This was true of Saul who persecuted believers until Jesus called out his name! Jesus told Mary not to touch him because he had not yet ascended. Why was this? He had not yet, as our high priest, gone up to the ark in heaven and sprinkled the blood of the sacrificial lamb there as the high priests had done in the temple once each year he was to go and do it once and for all. If a high priest was touched before he went into the Holy of Holies in the temple he was then unclean and could not enter to do his function. Jesus fulfilled all necessary to restore mankind's relationship to God then he returned to his disciples for 40 days. He is risen still!
