"Leaving Shame Behind"

Have you ever noticed that if you ask people what good they have things they often done have trouble making

a list of any length, but if you ask them about mistakes they've made they can give you a long list or at least indicate that the list is long if they do not want to admit to specifics.

So many people carry shame around like a treasure. They cling to it and make sure it is with them wherever they go. One could say they have a love-hate relationship with shame: they do not like the way it makes them feel, but they refuse to give it up because they think it is what they deserve.

Understanding that every person has done things they regret, I know I have, BUT let us remember what Jesus did to relieve people of the weight of shame.

³ He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. 4 Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considBy Mrs. Sojourner

ered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. ... ⁷ He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth... 8 ... for the transgression of my people he was stricken. 9 He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death. though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth. [a] (emphasis added)

He suffered the underlined things so we would not have to carry shame, sorrow etc. Verse 7 tells us "the punishment that brought us peace was upon him." We who accept Christ as Savior and Lord have this peace and can throw off shame like an old coat, leave it behind and walk through the rest of our lives in his freedom. He suffered so we would not have to carry our sins any more. Accept his sacrifice, his freedom, his


