"Focus? What Focus?"

So, in Deuteronomy 6:5 we are admonished to "Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." Jesus even reiterated this in the book of Matthew ". . . ³⁸This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹And the second is like it" 'Love your neighbor as vourself.' 40All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." Matt. 22:38-40 (NIV)

Our Heavenly Father has made it clear to us in both the Old and New Testaments that our focus is to love him first above all else and when we do this our priorities for everything else in life will fall into line.

A question to ponder today is, "What is your focus."

Most if not all arguments against keeping God as our main focus boil down to the matter of who we trust most. Many times I've heard The Sojourner wonder why people will trust God in the hereafter. but not for the here and now.

Let me encourage you today to trust God enough with the good and bad that you face by making sure he is your focus. Be ready, then, to record and tell the testimonies of God's glory working through you.
