Peace of mind-what a concept. So many people are wishing and searching for peace in their lives but they do not find peace. So who is in charge of peace, anyway? Is there a place where we can buy peace and how much does it cost? No, wait, what is peace? Perhaps this is the question we need to look at first. Really, after all, it would be a good idea to know what peace is.

Peace Defined

peace n.

- 1. The absence of war or other hostilities.
- 2. An agreement or a treaty to end hostilities.
- 3. Freedom from quarrels and disagreement: harmonious relations: roommates living in peace with each other.
- 4. Public security and order: was arrested for disturbing the peace.
- 5. Inner contentment; serenity: peace of mind. interi. [1]

Each of these meanings is accurate in the English lan-

guage of today and very desirable. What was the meaning of peace when the Prophet Isaiah prophesied

the Christ was coming? Isaiah called him the "Prince of Peace." Well now, that is very high up there so it must have been important. When Jesus Christ came and took on the sin of all, he repaired the breach between God and mankind. Let me explain and I'll come back to the word peace as used in scripture.

The Breach Of The Peace

When God placed mankind in the Garden East of Eden there was complete harmony with God and mankind. There was marvelous fellowship there. Every need of mankind was met. It was a wonderful place.

Then one day Satan entered into the situation and deceived mankind. That is when sin entered into mankind and there was a separation of man and his unfettered relationship

³⁵That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." ³⁶Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. with God, the Creator. Man began at that time to fall short — miss the mark of the perfection (sin) that had existed there in the Garden.

Restoration of peace

Now we come back to Isaiah and the "Prince of Peace" he speaks of in Isaiah 9:6

⁶ For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor. [a] Mighty God, Everlasting Father,

Prince of Peace.

There it is, "Prince of Peace!" Jesus is the "Prince of Peace' because he restored peace between God and mankind if an individual would accept the restoration. This acceptance by the individual is accomplished by simply accepting Jesus as Lord rather than Satan as Lord. Anyone who would do this would then be accepting or opening up the present-the gift Jesus had given them but they must open the gift—receive Jesus Christ. If a gift is never accepted even though it is theirs, they never receive the benefit of it. God does not

withhold the gift, but it must Notes: be accepted. **True Peace**

The word in Hebrew has multiple meanings, it is shalom peace but a much deeper meaning than we would think of, it means "nothing missing, nothing broken." Now to those who have accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior there is "nothing missing, nothing broken" as it was in the Garden east of Eden so long ago.

Garden living seems so foreign to us at first because we are accustomed to the rules of the world run by Satan the deceiver. Our spirits are restored, but our souls (minds) take a little longer. Our minds must be renewed. You see our thinking is accustomed to relying only on our senses and the dominating rules of the world. Now the Believer must learn to overcome the gravity of the world and replace it with the freedom of their authority over the world as a part of God's Kingdom of The Blessing. All was originally blessed in the Garden and now all is blessed in The Kingdom of God. There is nothing missing, nothing broken. That takes getting used to.
