"Surprise!"

Some years back The Sojourner us that the name Mary means "rebellion." He also taught us, what the Lord revealed to him, that God planted his seed in rebellion, so that out of rebellion his (God's) son was born to come and save the world. (The Sojourner said it much better than that, but that is the gist of what he said.)

So, back to Mary, rebellion was minding her own business just being a normal Jewish girl and SUDDENLY an angel appeared to her and announced that she was highly favored of God and chosen to bear the son of God.

This was not "perfection," or "peaceful," or "all-knowing," that was described as highly favored, and nothing in the scripture indicates that Mary did anything extraordinary that would set her apart from the other Jewish girls of the time, she was just the one God chose.

So from the aspect of her name meaning "rebellion" it would seem unlikely that God would choose Mary to mother his only Begotten Son but we must remember that God's ways are often very different from man's ways. He chose Mary and equipped her with everything she needed to do the tasks set before her.

Hebrews 11:1-8



How many times have I heard people speak of certainty and the desire for it regarding their faith.
