Most of us know the story from Luke that tells us that Joseph took Mary to Bethlehem so they could be counted in the census.

¹In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³And everyone went to his own town to register. ⁴So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. Lu 2:1-5 (NIV)

Here were Joseph and Mary standing in line with everyone else, doing what every other person in the land was doing. Standing in line they may have seemed ordinary, but Joseph and Mary's calling and purpose was anything but ordinary.

Can you imagine what was going through their heads? The person counted before them may have been thinking about the flocks he had to get back to. or the person behind them may have been wondering how his

business would suffer from his being away due to the census. But, Mary and Joseph were facing the imminent birth of the Son of God.

The people who saw Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem had no idea that they were the couple the Heavenly Father specifically chose to raise His only begotten Son.

Relate this to yourself. Each Believer has a specific gifting and purpose that our Heavenly Father has put inside him/her. The people who pass you on the street may not see or notice it at this time, but it most definitely is there. This divine seed planted in you by our Heavenly Father was put there for a specific time and when that time has come God will bring that divine purpose into the open for all to see. "Vine And Branches" (Teaching Sketch)

John 15:5-11



Vines are very interesting plants and they serve a number of functions. Vines can be decorative. fruit bearing, nuisances, and/or poisonous. The types of vines we have around can make a great deal of difference in our environment.

Characteristics

Some vines grow only along the ground while others climb on rocks, buildings, and trees. These are the vines that attach themselves to something stable and enduring. The word Jesus used in our scripture was of a vine that in the Greek meant "as coiling about a support." Jesus spoke of how close he and the Father were. They were very close. Jesus was so intertwined with the Father that they experienced the same things at the same time. Jesus spent a great deal of time with the Father in fellowship—a communion.

Everyone Is Attached

Everyone is attached in some manner to one or more things. These attachments have a great bearing on the life a person carries out, endures, or fulfills.

It is in fact the attach-

ments in our lives which shape us. A number of years ago a study was done to see what effect certain movies had on young minds as they were watched by young people. The findings were interesting. It seems the effect on behavior was based upon how the viewer had already attached his view of life. Those who had accepted criminal behavior as a way of life identified and had sympathy with the "bad guys" while those viewers who identified with the "good guys" were those who had not accepted criminal behavior as a way of life. You see it is identity of themselves they clung to and wound their lives around. They had made a choice at some point as to who they
